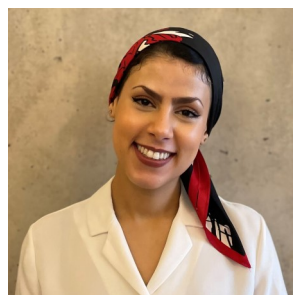


Katie O'Keefe | UNB
